## ENTRANCE TO CONFERENCE

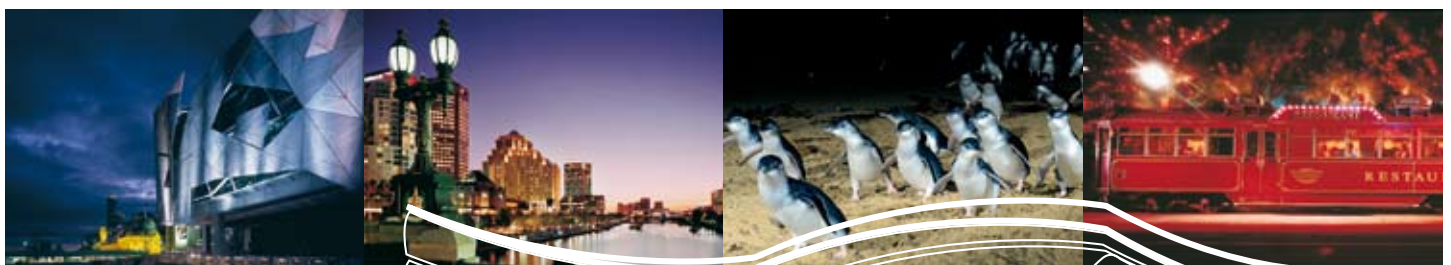
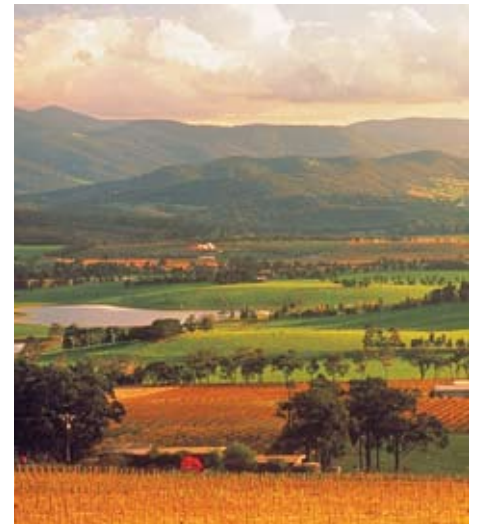
